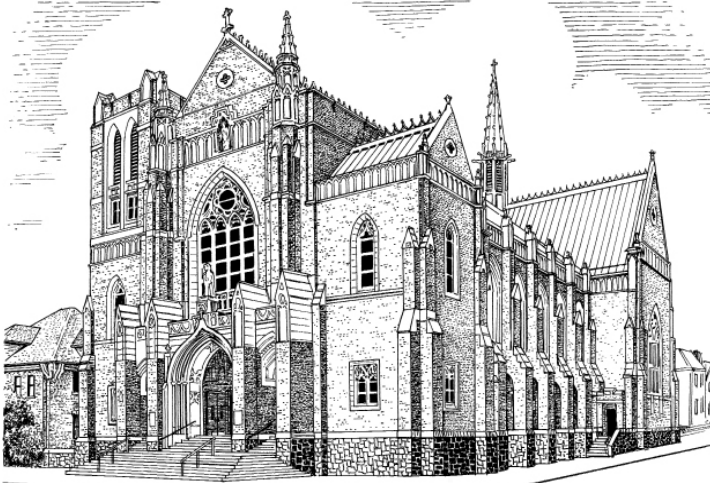

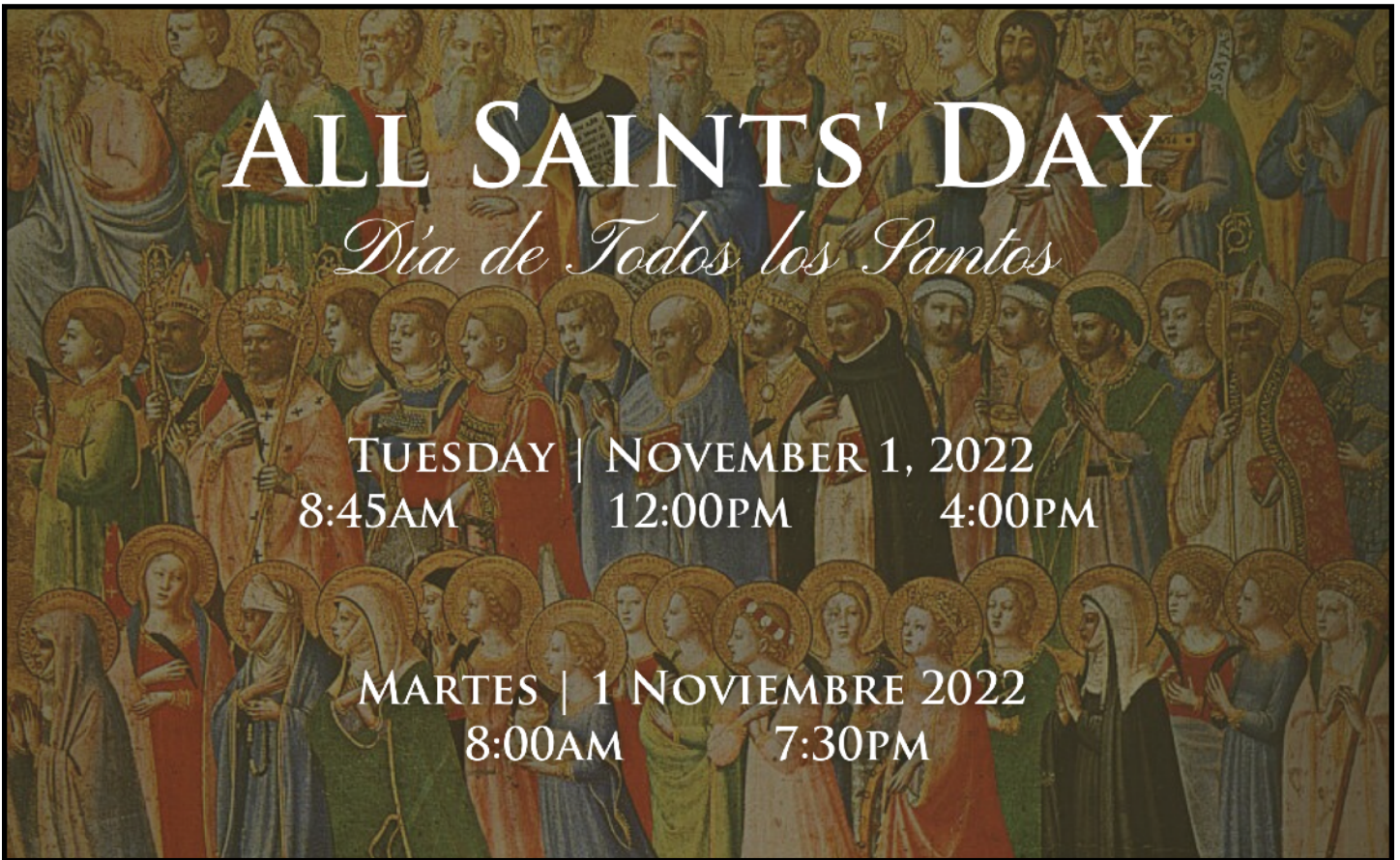

“Today, salvation has come to this house.”

The religious, social, and political lives of the Jews in Jesus' time considered people with any disease or poverty and the tax collectors as sinners. Jesus' preaching strongly condemned these ideas and thoughts. He preached a God of forgiveness, a merciful and compassionate God. In the Gospel of this Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus shows us the compassionate and merciful God through the experience of Zacchaeus, the Tax Collector. He makes it clear that these people, whom the Jewish mentality despised, the poor, the sick, and the sinners, are the favorites, for they are the patients who most need a doctor.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus invited Himself to Zacchaeus' house, knowing that as a tax collector, he was a sinner and thief and was despised by the Jewish community. But Jesus also knew that Zacchaeus wanted to look at Him, get to know Him, and truly see Him. Zacchaeus wanted to learn more about Jesus, so Jesus took the initiative and invited himself to his home. Zacchaeus happily opened not only the doors of his house but also those of his heart. Grateful, he offered a banquet to Jesus. To the Jewish mind, this attitude from Jesus was frowned upon and criticized. They could not conceive that Jesus would enter the house of a thief. They could not conceive that Jesus would be close to sinners and, thus, widely criticized. But Jesus, who always takes the opportunity to announce the good news of the kingdom, clarifies for them the plan of God for those they considered far from God. He told them that the poor, the sick, and the sinners are most appreciated and loved by God, because it was for them He was sent, and says, “are not the healthy who need a physician, but the sick.”

Today's Gospel offers us a great lesson. Zacchaeus provides us with the desire to see Jesus as he did and tells us that we must not let ourselves be overcome by obstacles. Zacchaeus faces his physical appearance. Being short was not an obstacle to looking for Jesus. The crowd that obstructed him was not an obstacle. He had no fear or shame in climbing the tree. Maybe some other people in those circumstances would have returned home without the experience of seeing Him. From this effort came the fruits of Jesus coming forward to greet him.

My brothers and sisters, how many times has Jesus wanted to be the guest at our homes, the guest in our hearts, but obstacles overcame us? How many emotions and feelings lay dormant in our hearts and have prevented us from seeing and experiencing the love, compassion, and mercy of Jesus? How many misunderstandings between couples or families prevent reconciliation and understanding, coming to a moment of forgiveness, in other words, to open our hearts to Jesus? No doubt that Jesus comes to meet us, and He invites Himself to our house to be our guest. We are invited today to overcome the obstacles and to hear from the mouth of Jesus, “Today salvation has come to this house.”

May God bless us all.

“Hoy ha llegado la salvación a esta casa”.

La cultura religiosa, social y política de los judíos en tiempos de Jesús pensaban que la enfermedad, la pobreza, y los que ellos consideraban pecadores, era el pago por los pecados cometidos por ellos o por alguno de sus antepasados. La predicación de Jesús fuertemente condenó esta postura predicando un Dios de perdón, un Dios compasivo, un Dios misericordioso, contrarrestando el Dios juez y condenatorio de la mentalidad judía. En el evangelio de este XXXI Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, a través de la experiencia de Zaqueo, Jesús predica a ese Dios compasivo y misericordioso, y nos deja claro que son esos que la mentalidad judía despreciaba, los pobres, los enfermos, los pecadores, que ellos son los preferidos de Dios porque son ellos esos enfermos que necesitan de médico.

En el evangelio de este domingo, Jesús se invitó así mismo a la casa de Zaqueo. Él sabía que Zaqueo, como publicano, era un pecador un ladrón y que era despreciado por la comunidad judía. Pero también sabía que Zaqueo quería conocerlo, quería verlo, quería saber más de Jesús, por ello Jesús toma la iniciativa de ir a su casa, y Zaqueo alegremente no solo le abrió las puertas de su casa, sino también las de su corazón. Agradecido, le ofreció un banquete. Para la mentalidad judía esta actitud de Jesús fue mal vista y criticada, no concebían como Jesús, quien se decía ser hijo de Dios, se relacionará con los pecadores, y fue muy criticado. Pero Jesús, quien siempre aprovecha las oportunidades para anunciar la buena noticia del reino, les aclara cual es el plan de Dios para los que ellos consideraban los alejados de Dios, les dijo que esos, los que ellos consideraban pecadores, condenados, lejos de Dios, son los más apreciados y queridos por Dios, porque para ellos Él fue enviado, y les dice “no son los sanos los que necesitan del médico, sino los enfermos”.

Este pasaje del evangelio nos ofrece una gran enseñanza. Zaqueo nos invita a como el, tener ese deseo de ver a Jesús, y nos dice que no hemos de dejarnos vencer por los obstáculos. Zaqueo al ser de baja estatura no podía verlo por la multitud que se lo impedía, sin embargo, no tuvo ni miedo, ni vergüenza para subir al árbol. Otro, frente a esas circunstancias tal vez se hubiera regresado a casa sin la experiencia de verle, de conocerle. Zaqueo no, venció el obstáculo de su baja estatura, venció el obstáculo de la gente que le impedía ver a Jesús, venció el obstáculo de subir al árbol, y ante esta actitud, vino el fruto, Jesús se adelanta a saludarlo, a darse a conocer, y hasta a pedirle que lo hospedara en su casa. Mis hermanas y mis hermanos, ¿cuántas veces Jesús ha querido también ser el huésped de nuestras casas, de nuestros corazones? y nosotros nos hemos dejado ganar por los obstáculos. ¿Cuántas emociones y sentimientos anidados, anestesiados en el corazón nos impiden ver y sentir a Jesús?, ¿cuántos malos entendidos entre parejas, entre familias impiden llegar a una reconciliación, a un entendimiento, a un momento de perdón?, en otras palabras, nos impiden abrirle el corazón a Jesús y tenerlo como huésped.

Sin duda que Jesús también sale a nuestro encuentro, y se invita a venir a nuestra casa, a ser nuestro huésped. Como Zaqueo, vencamos los obstáculos, y como el, convirtámonos a Dios, a Jesús, y también nosotros digámosle “voy a dar a los pobres la mitad de mis bienes” para poder escuchar de la boca de Jesús, “hoy ha llegado la salvación a esta casa”.

Que Dios nos bendiga.

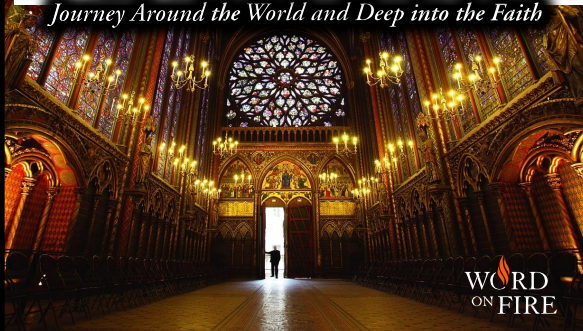
